Preventing Suicide in our Community



Glendon is involved in local and national efforts to prevent suicide and get at-risk individuals the help they need. Recent efforts have included teaching communities the effectiveness of restriction of means and the importance of responsible media coverage of suicide. Learn about our efforts and what you can do to make your community safer:

Restriction of Means

Restrictions of means is a key component of any effective suicide prevention strategy and is detailed in the Surgeon General's National Strategy for Suicide Prevention. Glendon's staff has dedicated considerable time to public outreach, and education on this issue, sharing current research findings with mental health professionals and the general public. One result of these efforts is the erecting of suicide barriers on the Cold Springs Bridge. Glendon was instrumental in educating Caltrans staff, first responders, media, law enforcement, and the community on the issues involved in restricting access to means for suicide. Recommendations for Media Reporting on Suicide

Reporting responsibly on suicide can change public misconceptions and can encourage those who are at risk for suicide to seek help. On the other hand, risk of additional suicides increases when a news story explicitly describes the suicide method, uses dramatic graphic headlines or images and when repeated/extensive coverage sensationalizes or glamorizes a death . It is crucial for any coverage of suicide to include the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 800-273-TALK and the local emergency response numbers. personal account from one attendee who captured the essence of what it's like to escape your daily routine and challenge the inner critic that holds you back in your life.

A couple weeks ago, I had the pleasure of attending a Conquer Your Critical Inner-Voice workshop at Esalen lead by Dr. Lisa Firestone and Joyce Catlett. Going into the weekend, I didn't exactly know what to expect, but it wound up being an incredible experience of personal growth.

Over the weekend, 15 of us met in a cottage for five two-hour workshops to learn about the Critical Inner-Voice, taking part in exercises to help us identify our negative thought patterns and discussing how these voices were affecting our lives. I was amazed at the immediate trust within the group of mostly strangers, each person was curious, open and honest. Lisa and Joyce were skillful and sensitive in addressing both the theory behind the Critical Inner-Voice and the personal feelings that arose.

The fact that all this personal development was happening in a setting as beautiful as Esalen was an incredible bonus. Between workshops, I strolled through the forests of Big Sur and soaked in the baths high above the Pacific Ocean. Three times a day, everyone would gather for the most delicious farm-fresh meals, which always included fresh baked bread. (I am still dreaming about the homemade gingerbread.) Throughout the weekend, I was able to identify goals that I had been neglecting and pinpoint the Critical Inner Voices that were getting in my way. I left Esalen feeling both refreshed and grateful. I was excited to get back to the world around me without being clouded by so many voices in my head.
